Learned counsel for the respondent has pointed out that the petitioner has no valid case or ground to stay in this country. The Maharashtra Government has already passed an order dated 31<sup>st</sup> December, 1996 directing him to leave the country. However, on behalf of petitioner it is submitted that the said order has not been served on the petitioner so far. The learned counsel for the petitioner has also made a grievance about the petitioner not being provided with basic necessities like food and medical aid etc. while he is being detained at the Refusal Room at the Indira Gandhi International Airport. The Counsel for the respondents however, denies this. In any case, it is ordered that at least the basic necessities like food and medical care should be provided to the petitioner so long as he is being detained at the said place.

Learned counsel for the respondents further points out that it has not been so far decided as to which place the petitioner will be deported. Till such a decision is taken, the petitioner will be kept at the place where he is being presently detained. The learned counsel further states that steps are being taken to expeditiously decide as

to where the petitioner is to be deported. Nothing further survives in this petition. The same stands disposed of.
