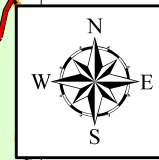


Eastern Equatoria State Map

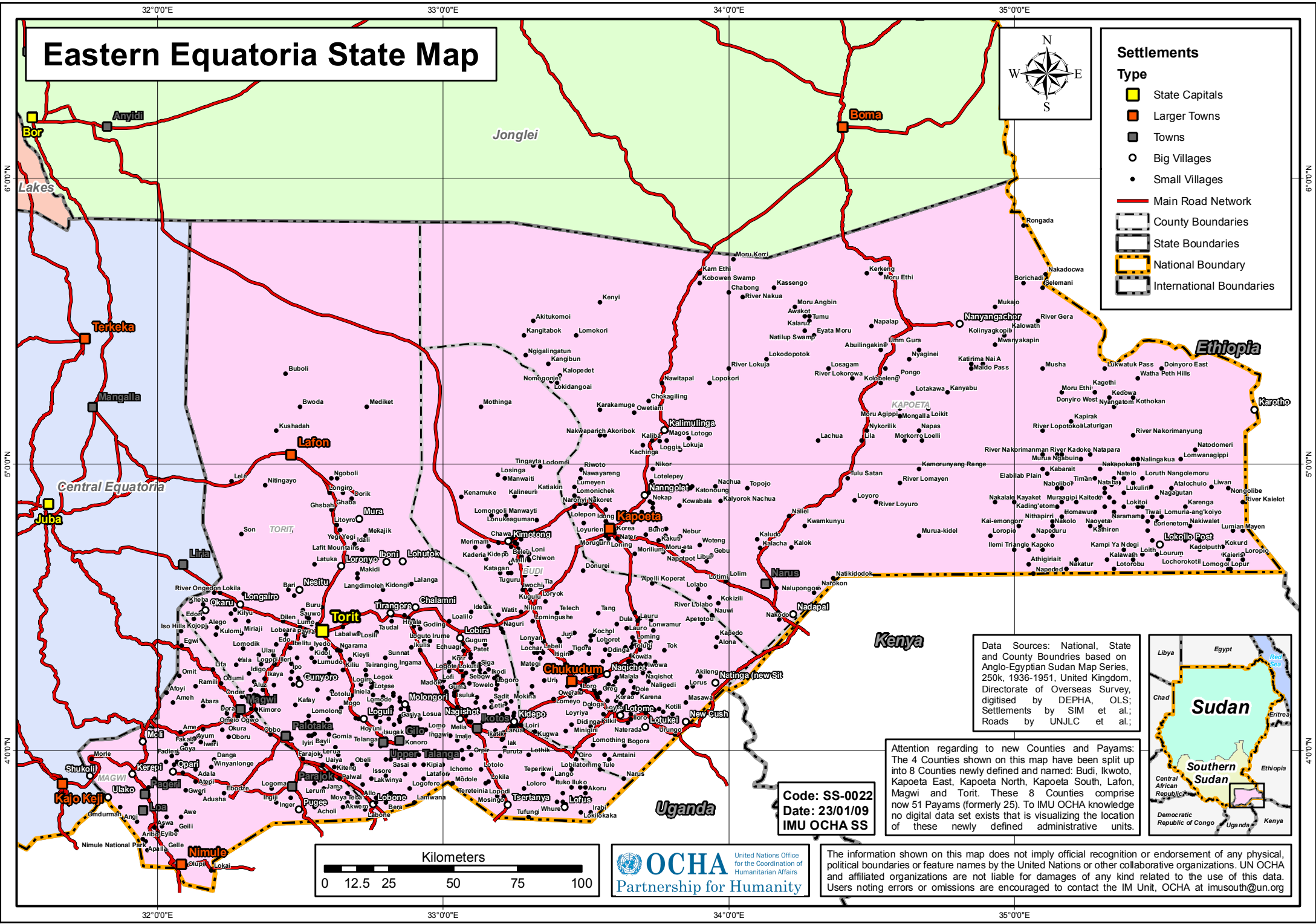

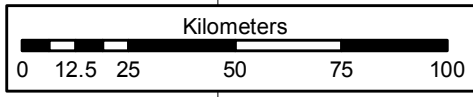

Attention regarding to new Counties and Payams: The 4 Counties shown on this map have been split up into 8 Counties newly defined and named: Budi, Ikwoto, Kapoeta East, Kapoeta North, Kapoeta South, Lafon, Magwi and Torit. These 8 Counties comprise now 51 Payams (formerly 25). To IMU OCHA knowledge no digital data set exists that is visualizing the location of these newly defined administrative units.

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
